The Newtown Neighborhood Association was founded in 1974 by a group of neighbors as a non-profit, voluntary membership organization of residents with the following goals:

- To preserve and improve the physical, aesthetic, architectural, historic, and environmental qualities of the Newtown Historic District and environs.
- To promote a spirit of neighborliness and charitable exchange among all residents.
- To promote preservation, maintenance, and restoration of houses or structures of historical, architectural, or cultural value and where necessary support demolition of structures that are deemed unsafe and whose restoration is not economically feasible.
- To foster and participate in projects to beautify and improve the neighborhood.
- To cooperate and work with other individuals and groups and the elected officials of Salisbury, Wicomico County and the State of Maryland in furtherance of these purposes.

The Newtown Association presents annual neighborhood events and supports neighboring groups such as the Boundless Garden in the Newtown Playground, City-owned Poplar Hill Mansion, the Charles Chipman Cultural Center, and the Joseph House Center and Village. Monthly meetings are held the second Wednesday of every month at 7pm in the Poplar Hill Mansion and all residents are invited to participate.
